1000 more workers for Victoria Harbour

Communications giant Ericsson is moving into its new purposebuilt national headquarters at Victoria Harbour this month, four months earlier than expected.

Owned by The GPT Group, the building will accommodate nearly 1000 Ericsson employees and is located at 818 Bourke St - between the National@Docklands and Dock 5.

The building offers about 21,500 square metres as well as ground floor retail (around 1500 square metres), lobby and service areas, and 175 car parking spaces plus 165 bicycle spaces.

Lend Lease Development's General Manager, Victoria, Maurice Cococcia, said the building

maximized natural light and used space efficiently.

"An atrium also runs through the building and with the north south orientation on the waterfront. More than 60 per cent of workers will have views of the water," he said.

Mr Cococcia said the delivery of Ericsson House was a real collaboration of effort.

"The partnership of Lend Lease Development, Lend Lease design and Bovis Lend Lease, and strong relationships with both The GPT Group and Ericsson enabled this fantastic outcome of delivering the project well ahead of schedule," he said.

Construction started in April 2006 and was completed by October 2007 with only fit out remaining before Ericsson starts to take up occupation in December.

Once completed, Victoria Harbour will be home to around 15,000 residents and workers.

New boutique apartments for Victoria Harbour

Lend Lease's Montage apartments at Victoria Harbour were launched on November 11.

Comprising nine floors, the building is to be surrounded by parklands with Docklands Park to the east and Victoria Green to the west and only metres from the harbour and Collins Street.

Lend Lease Development, General Manager, Victoria, Maurice Cococcia, said The Montage was an opportunity to combine Melbourne parkland living and city views right in the midst of Docklands.

"To have an apartment building with parks to the front and back, views over the city, and Collins St, the harbour plus the developing Merchant Street retail precinct only metres away, is unmatched anywhere in Melbourne," he said.

Many of the apartments offer dual aspect layouts, providing a seamless transition from indoor to outdoor space. This aspect is further enhanced by an expansive rooftop garden accessible to all occupants.

The Montage also includes only four contemporary penthouses and eight three story terrace homes.



Water transport a Council priority



Footscray Rd traffic changes

Traffic conditions have changed on Footscray Road to allow for construction works as part of the joint Federal-State Governments' Dynon Port Rail Link project.

Road lanes will be closed and concrete barriers will be installed, leaving three lanes operating in each direction. Roadwork speed limits will apply during construction.

The sealed bike and pedestrian path along Footscray Road will not be affected by the works.

When complete, a section of Footscray Road will be elevated to separate road traffic from two new rail lines into the Port of Melbourne.

Owners corporation update

New legislation to affect bodies corporate

The boom in apartment living in recent years has also led to a boom in bodies corporate. This in turn has highlighted just how inadequate the laws that govern bodies corporate are.

Things are about to change, with new regulations soon to be mandatory for bodies corporate over 100 lots, or as they'll now be known, owners corporations. All owners should be aware of how this may affect them.

According to Consumer Affairs Victoria (CAV), as recently as 1988 most bodies corporate were under five lots and were self-managed. Today, there are over 65,000 bodies corporate providing services estimated between 10 per cent and 25 per cent of all residential housing in Victoria with large tower developments and medium size developments increasingly expanding throughout the state.

The Valuer General has estimated the worth of strata title apartments to be around \$48 billion, which represents approximately seven per cent of the total of all property in Victoria.

Given the important role bodies corporate play in the rapidly expanding apartment market, a review was undertaken in 2003 to look at how to better address the changing needs and demands of this sector.

Following a three-year public consultation to clarify the issues and identify the gaps in the exiting laws, in September 2006 the Victorian Government's new Owners Corporations Act 2006 was passed while, the finalised Owners Corporations Regulations 2007 will come into effect on 31 December 2007.

The process dealt with a range of issues relating to governance, information and dispute resolution.

Melbourne City Councillor, David Wilson, said the new rules would make apartment ownership and living "easier to manage and better places to live ... Bodies corporate will now be called owners corporations to better represent owners and so they may better manage their resources."

The new act incorporates and builds on sections of the current Subdivision (Body Corporate) Regulations 20001 and Subdivision Act 1988.

The implementation and oversighting of the new regulations will be undertaken by CAV and, according to Dr Michael Kennedy of the Department of Justice, they will "empower owners and managers to work cooperatively, with an emphasis on self government. The new Act spells out the roles and responsibilities of all parties."

Owners corporations can either be selfmanaged or have paid managers, but these must now be registered with the Business Licensing Authority and will need professional indemnity insurance of at least

Other areas to be affected by the new legislation and regulations are:

- Clarification of the powers of the owners corporation. This includes how meetings are structured and run, including having agendas, taking minutes and who may call and run meetings.
- Information keeping and dissemination: The new Act requires that owners corporations keep records, or information registers, of its activities and that these be available to all current and new owners.

Dispute resolution. Until now there has been no formal dispute resolution process for owners apart from through the Magistrate's Court or the Supreme Court, both time consuming and costly processes. Now owners corporations will be required to have an internal dispute resolution process in place. In cases where either party is not satisfied, they will have the option of contacting CAV to mediate, and beyond that they will have access to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal

In addition, owners corporations will have to prepare and have audited financial statements, a maintenance plan including a maintenance sinking fund and regular valuations undertaken of common property. Within the regulations there are model rules to guide owners corporations and these can be adopted as they are or modified to suit individual owners corporations.

For blocks with less than 100 lots it is not mandatory to adopt the new regulations, Dr Kennedy said. "Well run small owners corporations should not be over burdened with regulations, but they can if they want, and we do encourage them to look at doing so," he said.

Dr Kennedy advised that due to the extent of the changes, the new regulations would be reviewed in two years time.

Owners corporations reception lukewarm

Although not everyone is enthusiastic about the new Owners Corporations Regulations that are to be introduced on 31 December 2007, most agree it had to happen.

Nolan Tower representative, Michele Anderson said: "(The new regulations) will create a lot more work for committees ... some property management groups are not set up for it, some of the smaller companies will struggle with it."

"We are currently revisiting all our rules, so it will cost more. But it has to change, it was too archaic," she said.

The onus within the new regulations is on fostering self-management while reducing the opportunity for mismanagement. According to Consumer Affairs Victoria (CAV) which is overseeing the changes,

this will be achieved through the implementation of procedures and mechanisms designed to introduce higher professional standards.

At a recent information night organised and supported by Residents 3000, questions from the floor were generally supportive of the need for change, although there was confusion over aspects of the new regulations.

Questions touched on aspects such as meeting structures, the mandatory threshold of 100 lots, committee responsibilities versus those of professional managers.

Ms Anderson said: "It will increase professionalism but the committees will have to know what to expect. There has to be a lot better understanding."

Present at the event were representatives from the Metropolitan Fire Brigade, Australian Customs, Life Saving Victoria, Victoria Police, Metropolitan Ambulance Service, Australian Red Cross, Powercor Children's Helicopter, State Emergency Service and St.John's

The event allowed residents to meet the people who work tirelessly to make the community safe. With the Police Band playing music throughout the day, kids and adults alike had the opportunity to get close to helicopters, boats, fire trucks and other technological devices used in rescues and emergencies throughout Melbourne.

Windy weather did not prevent an impressive turnout for this year's Community Safety Day, held in Docklands on Sunday, October 28. The event was organised in conjunction with Children's Week festivities, which commenced on October 20 and ended with a grand finale at Docklands.

Although the day's activities were aimed at people of all ages, the primary focus was on educating the younger generation about safety, accident prevention and how to act in the case of an emergency. Kids were able to collect a Passport to Safety document at the main pavilion by following the instructions in the passport and answering a series of questions about safety. One of the most popular exhibits on the day was the Australian Customs patrol boat. The queue for a tour of the vessel and its array of machinery and weapons grew longer and longer as the day progressed. The windy conditions seemed to add to the experience by emulating what life at sea must be like for the crew, with the boat swaying in the strong winds.

The Australian Customs detector dog demonstration was a hit. The skill of the trainers was clearly visible however custom's officers were overshadowed by the intelligent behaviour of the canines that wowed the crowds with their ability to perform various tasks and duties.

The arrival of the Powercor Children's Helicopter gave children and adults the chance to examine the flight controls of the

helicopter and the emergency equipment stored onboard of the aircraft. Crew members were on hand to explain in detail the complex nature of the helicopter operations and share their personal on-the-job experiences.

The Metropolitan Fire Brigade drew large crowds with its range of fire trucks, rescue equipment and even motorbikes. Residents were allowed to sit inside the fire trucks, examine the impressive array of rescue equipment and have their photos taken with MFB firemen.

Unfortunately, due to strong winds experienced on the day, several planned activities on the harbour had to be cancelled.

Serviced apartments ... love 'em or hate 'em

As a mixed-use area it is not surprising that serviced apartments are as much a part of the Docklands make-up as are residents, restaurants and great city views. But, like most elements in the mix they can create as much friction as they do benefits for the local area.

At a rough estimate there are between 350-400 serviced apartments offering short and long-term accommodation throughout the Docklands precinct at any one time. But as the number of apartments the half dozen or so operators manage can vary over time, it's anyone's guess how many there really are.

Nolan Tower body corporate chairperson Michele Anderson said: "There are issues. Of course, not all serviced apartments create problems. It's really the ones with a shortterm turnover that can create extra wear and tear and maintenance issues without extra contributions to the body corporate

go, but I think at times we can be a bit of a scapegoat," she said.

"We're all in this together. Tourism is so important, and (serviced apartments) are one element helping to put Docklands on the map. There are lots of great reasons to have them here, but with any mixed-use area getting the balance right with so much happening, is all part of the growing process."

Other issues associated with serviced apartments can involve operators subleasing from owners and not advising them of how they intend to use the apartment. This can create problems regarding security and safety issues within the buildings, with managers not having the


instances, the management group details for emergency contact.

Ms Chamings said: "We only manage apartments on behalf of owners, we don't sub-let at all. Many owners are investors who may be from overseas or interstate or regional Victoria who will use the apartment when in town but want to make money out of it the rest of the time."

"It's a really positive environment here at Docklands. Seeing the place crawling with visitors and spending money is really great, but it can only exist if there are investors as well."

Ms Chamings added: "We are happy to work with all stakeholders and encourage and invite all property and building managers to talk to us about any issue that may arise, but the issues are not exclusive to any one user.

As stakeholders we've got to work together."

Another piece in the **Docklands jigsaw**

VicUrban has announced a joint venture development for the south-west corner of Bourke St and Wurundjeri Way - one of the last parcels of uncontracted land in Docklands.

International investment firm Babcock & Brown has partnered with Melbourne architect Metier3 and education provider Global Campus Management to develop the 7970sqm site at 717 Bourke St.

The development will comprise a 17 level office tower and a separate 294 room Travelodge Hotel. Both buildings will be

complemented by ground floor and podium level retail and 471 car spaces.

The first tenant in the office tower will be an education facility which will feature ESMOD, an internationally acclaimed fashion school and a design school offering courses in multimedia, interior design, fine arts and photography.

VicUrban's General Manager - Docklands and Major Projects, Michael Hynes, said this key site would deliver a mixed use development with a high educational focus to complement existing education services in Docklands.

"The development will deliver the first hotel of this type to Docklands catering for increased market demand from major new tenants

and visitors with the imminent arrival of attractions such as the Observation Wheel," he said.

Mr Hynes said attractors for the site included its proximity to Southern Cross Station, Telstra Dome and its Bourke Street address.

The building, designed by architect firm Metier3, aims to achieve a 5 Star Green Star rating.

Construction is anticipated to commence later this year and completion is expected in 2010.

While Docklands is currently one third complete or under construction, approximately 95 per cent of its land has been contracted for development.



Wine reviews

Hahn Barossa - Yanyarrie Shiraz 05

This wine is an unwooded, distinctly fresh style made from Eden Valley and selected central Barossa vineyards.

It has a pale green colour and aromas of tropical fruit with a distinctive citrus freshness. The palate shows typical ripe peach fruit from the central Barossa with a tangy lemon/lime lifted flavour from the notably cooler High Eden Ridge.

Arguably, one of the best seasons for white wines that we will see in our lifetime! The critical ripening months of January, February and March were cooler than average and have a significant contribution to the lean, steely and mineral qualities of this wine

Colour - Yellow with soft pale green throughout

Nose - Aromas of tropical fruit and a distinctive citrus freshness.

Palate - The palate portrays ripe peach fruit with a tangy citrus (lemon/lime) flavour.

Drink - Now - 2010

Di Giorgio Shiraz

The Di Giorgio Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon vines date back to 1963 with the other varieties planted in 1979. These mature vines make a dramatic statement about the key location of the winery. This highlights their intrinsic value as a source of premium fruit in the heart of Coonawarra.

This is a generous wine giving masses of ripe shiraz character. Cellaring will see the development of cedar and savoury characters. It will remain a great example of Coonawarra Shiraz for up to a decade.

Colour - Deep purple red colour

Nose - Ripe raspberry and mulberry mingled with black pepper and spice. With a hint of charry oak.

Palate - Smokey oak and forest berry fruits create a full-bodied palate, which leads to a soft and juicy finish.

This "evolving" beer from the Docklands Brewhouse, contains pale wheat malt that gives the classic banana and fruit aromas expected of this style, whilst the lemon myrtle gives a refreshing citrus finish which is not challenged by an abundance of hops.

This is a great summer beer which is a perfect accompaniment for Asian stir fries, or fresh prawns.


