

Santa got into the Docklands way of life in late November when he steamed into Victoria Harbour aboard the magnificent Chase III.


Melbourne Boat Sales' Lee Vitiello picked up Santa a fair bit south of the North Pole and delivered him safely to Harbour Town.

Boaties upset on parking

Charter boat operators say they are being further squeezed by a City of Melbourne decision to restrict their parking on Central Pier.

The operators say they had a working arrangement with VicUrban and Altantic Group [v] whereby each boat had two carparking spaces available.

But this was changed without consultation last month when the council wrote telling them that only one vehicle would be accommodated and that parking permits were not transferable to any other vehicle. Other vehicles would have to pay, the council said.

Melbourne Show Boat operator Jeff Gordon said it was further evidence that the council wanted to force the charter boats out of Docklands.

'We bring so many people to Docklands and add a badly needed dimension to the area but we are just not appreciated," Mr Gordon said.

Restaurateur Lou Jovanovski said the decision was "ridiculous". "Why would you do it at the busiest time of the year," he said.

"How do we service our boats and why do we need to pay Atlantic when their lease doesn't cover the western end of the pier?"

"What it shows is that no one wants the charter boats. They all talk about activating the waterfront, but no one does anything to activate it," Mr Jovanovski said.

He said Melbourne had the worst charter fleet anywhere outside the third world. Docklands offered no pump-out facilities or anywhere to maintain boats, he said.

He said half of his fleet of four was already leaving Melbourne for the Gold Coast and he had to decide in the New Year whether to pull out of Docklands altogether.

"How can we sit here with no home? We've done it for 12 years," Mr Jovanovski said.

A VicUrban spokesperson said Central Pier Docklands was allowed to charge for parking between Sheds 9 and 14. The lease provides for 10 spaces for boat operators which are exempt from any charges.

The City of Melbourne manages the parking on the pier on behalf of VicUrban.

The VicUrban spokesperson said the lease did not include the public space west of Shed 9, although Central Pier Docklands had recently requested a separate licence to allow parking in this area.

"VicUrban is currently considering this request, in context with its priority that the area be available for public events and activities," the spokesperson said.

It's not Car Fair, says business

A Docklands business has closed after being told it does not fit in with VicUrban's sustainable image.

The Car Fair traded for only five weeks at its location between Waterfront City and the Bolte Bridge.

The Car Fair, a private used-car market, began operating in early October but after one week was told that VicUrban would not renew its three-month trial licence.

The Car Fair's Managing Director, Aaron Hockley, said: "We tried to bring a business to the Docklands which, based on overseas experience, would have brought thousands of people to the area. VicUrban destroyed our dream."

VicUrban's Docklands Development Director, Simon Wilson said: "The event was inconsistent with VicUrban's focus

on promoting sustainable development and communities that are close to public transport are pedestrian and bike friendly and encourage decreased reliance on car use."

Mr Wilson claims VicUrban had made it clear from the start that the licence was always only short-term. "As the area in question has always been intended for permanent development, temporary licences are most commonly issued," he said.

But Mr Hockley disputes this and says VicUrban had encouraged him to believe he would have its support in Docklands in the longer term.

Mr Hockley said the Car Fair invested close

to \$200,000, including more than \$100,000 in marketing, and it had attended more than 20 meetings with Docklands stakeholders to comply with what he described as VicUrban's "onerous requirements".

"Unfortunately, as discussed with VicUrban on several occasions, the Car Fair is not able to break even during its first few months of operation so, after obtaining legal advice, we had to close down operations to avoid incurring unrecoverable costs," Mr Hockley said.

Mr Wilson said: "VicUrban strongly supports efforts and events aimed at activating Docklands and works closely with the City of Melbourne and developers to promote the precinct and its attractions."

The Car Fair was operating in the area previously occupied by Cirque du Soleil and the area continues to be unused.

The Car Fair has vowed to pursue legal action if VicUrban fails to provide compensation.

Southern Star to have new design

Docklands' Southern Star Observation Wheel will return with a slightly different design.

A spokesperson said the wheel's operators were taking the opportunity to improve on the structure which failed in January this year.

"We could have rebuilt the wheel in the same configuration with the majority of the original materials. However, we made the deliberate decision to subtly alter the original configuration and build with new materials," the spokesperson said.

"As announced in May this year, only the columns, hub and wheel building will be retained. We are currently finalising design details for the new wheel, but it will still be a seven-pointed Federation Star," the spokesperson said.

The wheel stopped operating in January following a three-day heatwave when cracks were found in supporting members.


I totally support the Port of Melbourne Corporation in its aspiration to link the Dynon and Webb parts of the port.

Premier is impressed with ANZ's progress

The Premier John Brumby and ANZ chairman Charles Goode officially opened the ANZ Centre in Docklands on November 6.

In his speech, Mr Brumby remarked at how often he had been in Docklands this year to open or launch new projects.

Mr Brumby recounted that the Bank of Australasia (as the ANZ was then known) opened its first Melbourne branch in a small cottage in 1838.

Mr Brumby read from an historical record that the bank's manager wrote to reassure his Sydney head office that he and his assistant slept with the cash chest between their beds for safekeeping.

According to Mr Brumby, the manager went on to say: "Progress is being made and accounts opened apace."

Mr Brumby said the bank's subsequent 171 years in Melbourne had continued in the same positive vein. "The pace of progress has not slackened," he said.

The 10-storey building is Australia's largest single commercial occupancy and provides a gross floor area of 130,000 square metres, including 83,550 square metres net lettable area of office space, and 1900 square metres of retail.

This represents a floor area equivalent in size to the Rialto in a low rise building. This has been achieved through the creation of a series of floorplates of approximately 2000 square metres interconnected via bridges and walkways.

Docklands is **50/50** on big bar

Docklanders don't particular mind large licensed premises, according to the latest Docklands News online survey.

In the lowest response to one of our surveys, only six people responded - with half saying Docklands wants and needs a bar the size of Platform 28.

Platform 28 was recently granted a permit by Planning Minister Justin Madden. It is a tayern for 750 patrons at the Bourke St end of the historic Goods Shed North.

Platform 28 is currently seeking a liquor licence but is being opposed by the City of Melbourne.

According to a spokesperson from the Department of Justice the Platform 28 application is currently "going through the process" and it will be at least another couple of weeks before a recommendation is made.

Our online survey attraction only one comment: "The proposal to add life to that area of Docklands is fantastic, although I hope it's more restaurant/bar that doesn't result in too much noise out on the streets."

18 months later, Woolshed to win a liquor licence

After nearly a year and a half, Woolshed Pub on Central Pier is to be granted a liquor licence and will open for business.

After originally applying for a general 1 am licence for 1445 people, the pub's owners will have to operate with an on-premises licence for 675 patrons.

The Director of Liquor Licensing rejected the pub's original application in January this year. By the time the pub's appeal to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT) started in earnest in September, it was asking for 1062 patrons until 11pm and 556 from then until closing time.

The ruling means its doors to the south and the east will be closed at 10pm and amplified music will be banned in all external areas of the pub.

Trading in the external areas to the south and east will cease at 11pm but will be permitted outside in the northern area between Shed 9 and Shed 14 until midnight.

The Woolshed's balcony at the front of the premises will close at 11pm and VCAT has ordered a tray shelf to be removed on the southern and eastern sides of the balcony.

Whilst these rulings have been made, the case is continuing. Still to be determined are:

- The impact, if any, of the Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006;
- Patron capacity numbers for the external areas;
- A proposal that patrons in the external areas be seated after 9pm;
- Whether a 1.8 metre barrier on the southern and eastern boundaries should have only have a single external opening, and the location of such an opening; and
- The finalisation of a security management plan and standard operating procedures.

It is not know when these matter will be resolved as the judge hearing the case has been promoted to the Supreme Court and is unavailable.

Opposing the Woolshed Pub in VCAT was the Director of Liquor Licensing and Docklands resident Peter Henderson.

Neither Mr Henderson nor the Woolshed Pub would comment on the outcome of the case as it has not yet concluded.

Some 13 other residents filed statements: Rod Bertram; Paul Hedley; Ronald Clarke; Glenyss Mackenzie; Pamela Pearce; Karl Berberich; Mohammad Aldeen; Helen Henderson; Jeanette Shaw; Dominic Healy; Michelle Velkovski; Dennis Ginn and Simon Delzoppo.

These residents said their amenity was currently being adversely affected by existing licensed premises in the vicinity of Dock 5.

The tribunal heard that when they purchased their apartments they were told (by Lend Lease representatives) that any future development in the area, including on Central Pier, would not disturb their amenity.

Senior Sergeant Peter Seel told VCAT that the Regional Licensing Unit was presently receiving "numerous noise and other amenity complaints from residents in the Docklands area pertaining to licensed venues".

He concluded his statement by saying: "In the current climate of patron behaviours I would seriously recommend an objection to any night club venue with patron numbers over 200 anywhere in Melbourne. Experience time and again has shown that a larger nightclub venue, rather than smaller venue, will be associated with problems in and around the venue before during and after the entertainment and migratory issues between entertainment precinct bars and clubs. Melbourne police are having difficulty coping with problems of drunkenness and anti-social behaviour now and this proposal will result in an increased drain on resources and have an adverse impact on the amenity of Melbourne."

"I don't think I'll do it again," she said. "Frank's happy with one."











Verandah project delayed until 2010

Having missed its starting date, VicUrban says that the redevelopment of Harbour Esplanade will start in the first half of 2010.

The project was due to start this year but VicUrban says the change of ownership of Melbourne's tram service is to blame for the delay.

The redevelopment, known as Melbourne's Verandah, is designed to optimise the public space and transform the area into a key waterfront destination.

The project will provide a specific pedestrian pathway, a designated bicycle track, additional parkland and will realign the tram tracks to the centre of the road to create a more efficient service.

VicUrban's General Manager for Project Planning and Innovation, David Young, says the project is not only about creating a major waterfront destination, but is also about providing parks and opens spaces to Docklands residents.

"The creation of a new heart comprising open and green spaces, is also expected to better connect the areas of Docklands, while enhancing Docklands' integration with wider Melbourne," Mr Young said.

The redevelopment will be rolled out in stages, with stage one expected to take up to a year to complete.

Stage one will involve the relocation and replacement of trees, the creation of two new platform tram stops north of Latrobe St and the construction of designated bicycle and pedestrian tracks.

Docklands master developer VicUrban has moved into the sumptuously-refurbished Good Shed North building which runs between Collins and Bourke streets in Docklands.


Some 600 staff from VicUrban, the Building Commission and the Plumbing Industry Commission will inhabit the \$63 million renovation.

Garden ideas are blooming

The Urban Reforestation project continues to gain momentum in Docklands with community and business meetings last month to chart future directions.

Garden founder Emily Ballantyne-Brodie said more than 15 residents had expressed interest in having their own plots.

And at the business workshop on November 18, she urged $\,$

participants to think outside the box. "It's a blank canvas and we want to know what you think," she said.

One idea gaining popularity is to extend the garden onto moored barges in Victoria Harbour.

Ms Ballantyne-Brodie said this could overcome a shortage of publicly available land in Docklands and also provide an iconic identity for Melbourne.

Urban Reforestation and the Rotary Club of Docklands are currently in discussions about ways they can collaborate to benefit the local community.

Enhancing north-west Docklands



Bold plan to cut carbon emissions

VicUrban is planning to make Docklands more carbon and water neutral

In a report to the Docklands Co-ordination Committee, acting environment director Karen Keegan said VicUrban had been working since July 2008 on a Docklands Environmental Innovation Strategy.

She said the strategy aimed at implementing best environmental practice in yet-to-be constructed buildings as well as introducing a number of precinct-wide alternative energy and water supply initiatives.

It is suggested that:

■ A network of tri-generation power plants could supply low carbon electricity and heated and chilled water to Docklands buildings;

- Stormwater from Dudley St could be harvested and treated for re-use in Docklands; and
- A sewerage treatment plant could be located at the north of Docklands Park, feeding off the Dudley St sewer main.

Ms Keegan told the committee that if Dockland's current use of power and water did not change, it would annually use 371 Gwh of power and and 2.1 GL of water.

However, with the suggested innovations, by the time Docklands is fully developed, water demand could be cut by up to 39 per cent and up to 26 per cent less carbon might be released into the atmosphere.



It's payback time

Professor Ian Harper had some words of warning for Docklands' businesses when he addressed them at breakfast on October 30.

"You don't get nothing for nothing folks," he said in reference to the looming cost of paying back the national fiscal stimulus which had averted a serious recession in Australia.

Professor Harper is a member of City on a Hill (previously known as Docklands Church) and spoke at the first event which kicked off the church's community weekend.

"Interest rates will rise and taxes will have to be realigned to recoup the money which has been spent," he said. "The bill needs to be repaid."

The Access Economics director said the global financial crisis stemmed from greed and was fundamentally a moral rather than a legislative problem.

"If the basis of the problem is a moral problem, then no laws can help," he said.

He said it was time to have a conversation about the bad behaviour which had led to \$4 trillion (four times the output of the Australian economy) being wiped out.



From the Institute

The Institute's commission to design a general restaurant assessment code has been suspended.

This is a sorry day because there remains a clear public need for consistency across the medium of advice about food and restaurant criticism. After all, what is a Michelin Star. and how is a tyre company involving itself in such an enterprise, you might well ask?


The code system was intended to comprise all the factors commonly discussed in restaurant reviews and in this regard we have considered those in the daily newspapers, the Qantas in flight magazine and advertising brochures from power boat insurers. Many factors are important to persons considering purchasing a meal. These include ambient noise, the type, quality and price of the cuisine, the obsequiousness of service, the extent of wheel chair access, the depth of the wine list and if there is a view. Much time and effort has resulted in the development of the software algorithm which incorporates these elements and produces a number from 1 through to 9.

At the first glance, some authorities expressed surprise that information sought about such a thing as the freshness of fish can be gleaned from a mere number. The ability of the system to do this lies in reference to standard meal around which all the calculations referred to above are related. For this, the Institute chose a dish considered as a quintessentially modern Australian



and Melbourne and reflecting the post war migration and cultural benefit to the eating experience: chicken parmigiana.

However, whilst the Institute was in the process of demonstrating the utility of the codes, an unsatisfactory development occurred which has temporarily derailed the program and caused increased costs and delay. The flaw revealed itself when it was noticed that no restaurant in the Docklands pilot project precinct carried, prepared or served parmigiana whether veal or chicken or eggplant. Accordingly no scores were able to calculated. It has to be admitted that this would be unhelpful to a person using the code to assess the suitability of a restaurant to which to take themselves or family for lunch.

Vega, who has more then 20 years experience in the industry, will be supported by local Melbourne DJs including Franky D and DJ Jori at the day party.



Harbour Town Hotel:

You've probably spent all year meaning to go, but with Christmas approaching, isn't it time you finally checked out Harbour Town? Did you even know that there was a hotel right down the back – just head towards the giant... oh, well, never mind.

Harbour Town Hotel is a classic "pub" pub. It does a decent parma and also has a \$15 lunch special. Be warned – if you're still there at five, happy hour kicks in.

Please note – you are not advised to drink and shop, although given the year Harbour Town's

had, maybe you could afford to spread a little of that Christmas cheer around ...

James Squire Brewhouse:

Nothing says "It's holiday time!" more than blazing sunshine sparkling off the water and views of it abound from Squire's Brewhouse. The casual but substantial pub grub and extensive beer list provides a fun, low-key place to wind down with work mates. A touch of Australiana is scattered throughout the menu, with a Ploughman's Lunch, Lemon Myrtle Squid Salad and a Macadamia Encrusted Ocean Trout vying for space alongside your parmas and fish and chips. Located right at the western tip of Waterfront City's promenade, you can also walk it all off on the long walk back to the office.

Man Mo:

For something a little different and slightly upmarket yet with minimum fuss, convince the office to share one of the banquets at Man Mo. Normally, I hate to share, but each and every morsel of this Chinese / Malayasian spread surprises and satisfies. A Tasmanian

eye fillet in black peppercorn sauce even makes an appearance in the Christmas banquet, which also sees Green Crayfish Tails, Prawns in a Spicy Creamy Pumpkin Sauce and Peking Duck Pancakes on offer. Somehow, it all seems a quintessentially and delightfully Australian experience ...




So relax, enjoy the simple pleasure of a glass of wine with friends by a startlingly sparkly plastic tree, and spoil all those around you with your presence.




